- Pilot actions that are planned within the project CMB

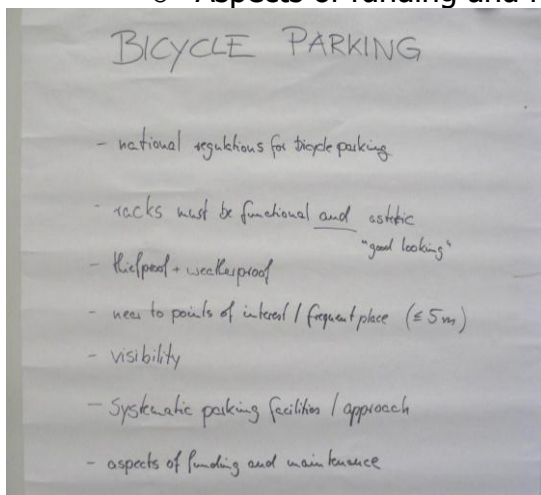
After the cities presentations, the members where devided into three groups to discuss the following subjects:

- Bicycle parking
- Soft measures
- Low cost/painting measures

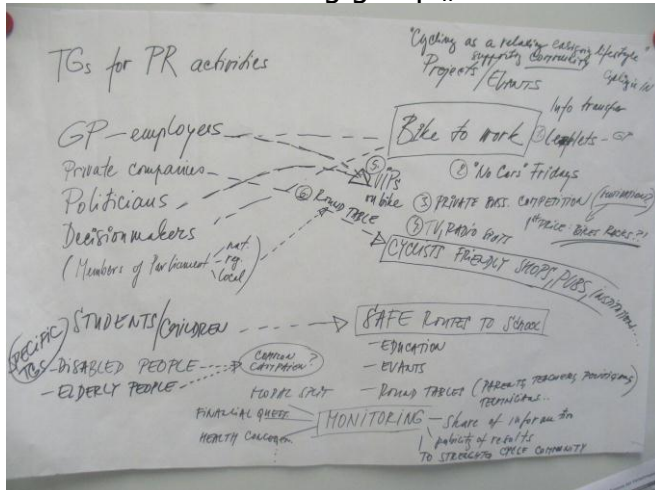
The results of the working groups were presented by PP

Presentation of working group „bicycle parking“

- National regulations for bicycle parking are required
- Racks must be both, functional and aesthetic
- Racks must be thiefproof and weatherproof
- Rack must be situated near to points of interest/frequent plases (distance less than 5 m)
- Visibility of the racks is important
- Systematic parking facilities/apporach
- Aspects of funding and maintenance

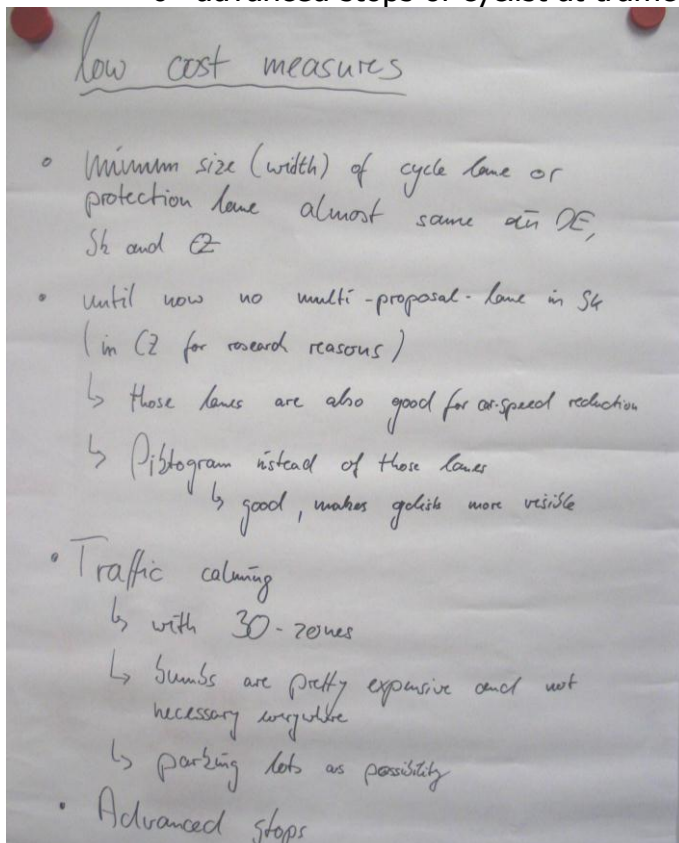


Presentation of working group „soft measures“



Presentation of working group „lowcost/painting measures“

- Minimum size (width) of cycle lane or protection lane almost the same in Germany, SK, and CZ
- Until now, there is no multi-proposal lane in SK (in CZ for research reasons)
 - Those lanes are also good for car-speed reduction
 - Poictogramm instead of those lanes (it is good, because they make the cyclist more visible)
- Traffic calming
 - with 30km/h-zones
 - bumps are pretty expensive and not necessary in every case
 - parking lots are possible
- advanced stops of cyclist at traffic lanes



Summary of the Workshop

The Workshop was well received with the PP. The discussion in groups were very lively. The exchange of experience of partners from different countries, which is a core objective of the project CMB, was very successful. Some partners brought plans of current projects, which were reflected by the other expert. PP requested for the next meeting to have a similar workshop again.
